KRAKOW OLD TOWN

Krakow's Old Town is one of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. A historic, charming and best-preserved old town in all of Europe, has been home to legendary figures like Copernicus and John Paul II. Pay a visit to get an overview of the Old Town's past, filled with glory and tremendous tragedy.



AUSCHWITZ-BIRKENAU

Established by the Nazis in 1940, Auschwitz-Birkenau has become a symbol of terror, genocide and the Holocaust. Although the exact number of victims is unknown, many Jews, Poles and gypsies died here. The museum consists of two parts: Auschwitz I, the first and oldest camp (the number of prisoners fluctuated around 15,000, sometimes rising above 20,000) and Auschwitz II, Birkenau (which held more than 90,000 prisoners in 1944).



KRAKOW PINBALL MUSEUM

Retro arcade with a diverse array of classic pinball and video games from the 80s to 00s, including two-player options and all-day play in a nostalgic setting.



KRAKOW RYNEK GLOWNY CENTRAL

Vibrant city hall area with a mix of markets, shops, and eateries, complemented by lively street performances and a historic indoor market known for unique gifts.



WAWEL ROYAL CASTLE

Historic castle grounds home to diverse art collections, royal apartments, and a fire-breathing dragon sculpture, with scenic riverbank views and family-friendly exhibits.



STATE MIASTO

The 13th century merchants' town is home to Europe's largest market square and offers numerous historical houses, palaces and churches with magnificent interiors, 14th century fortifications.



ST MARY'S BASILICA

Historic church with hourly trumpet calls from the tower, showcasing gothic architecture, intricate stained glass, and the famed Veit Stoss altar. Enjoy serene views and rich cultural history.
